Nur	In EYFS, History is taught through Understanding the World. The children learn about past and present events in their own lives and others. They begin to make sense of their own life story and their family history. They start to compare and contrast characters within stories, identifying the difference between then and now. They learn about key events in History that have shaped the world today, e.g. Guy Fawkes, Rosa Parks and are able to talk about these events demonstrating an understanding that it happened in the past. Through communication and language the children learn and begin to use historical vocabulary e.g. past, present, now, then, a long time ago.
