Overall rationale and objective

At St Mark's School, we love music. Most of the day you will hear music being played through IWB in our classrooms or children singing their morning, lunch time or end of the day prayers. We are a loud school!

We enjoy our music lessons and look forward to embracing all that music has to offer to our school setting. We aim to inspire children, increase aspirations, relieve stress, improve concentration, communication and listening skills, build creativity and give all children a chance to succeed.

KS1 – KS2

Children participate in a weekly music lesson with their class teacher who makes use of the online musical resource Charanga. This enables delivery of music across school to be consistent and enables staff to drive children's development within music. The aim is for each year group to build upon the learning from prior year groups helping to develop depth of understanding and progression of skills. This scheme of work is sued as a base to aid and enhance our teaching, but is not intended to be rigidly adhered to. Teachers should make professional judgements about when to adapt, miss out or add additional materials where this would benefit learning.

Children are taught to sing songs, make music and dance. Children are given opportunities to experiment with ways of changing sound and develop an understanding of pulse rhythm and pitch. Children follow a scheme of work from Charanga Music School and enjoy listening and responding to different styles of music, learning to sing, joining in with nursery rhymes and action songs which leads to playing classroom instruments and performing for others. Children are also encouraged to use everyday objects to make music and create sound. All children have opportunities to apply their learning by participating in performances in and out of school.
