
# **Nursery**

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## Literacy - We have been reading:



Happy To Be Me – The children celebrated what makes them special, talking about their **bodies**, **feelings**, **and families**, and learning to appreciate themselves and others.



Pete The Cat – The children explored colour, pattern, resilience, and keeping a positive attitude—just like Pete! Through play and exploration, they learned that it's okay when things don't go to plan.

### **Nursery Highlights**

<u>Understanding the World –</u> Nursery have been learning all about themselves and their families, sharing their own life stories and talking about the people who are important to them. We have explored our school community, learning about the different places and people who help us every day. The children also enjoyed celebrating birthdays and taking part in Black History Month, learning about inspirational people and different cultures in fun, age-appropriate ways.

Expressive Art and Design- This term, the children have enjoyed exploring their creativity in many different ways. We looked at the artist Yayoi Kusama, creating colourful, patterned artwork inspired by her dot designs. The children have also made beautiful seasonal transient art, painted patterns and images, and explored music and dance using their bodies and instruments. A real highlight was baking biscuits inspired by stained glass windows, combining art and creativity with a tasty treat!

#### **Phonics**

The children have been enjoying lots of fun, playful activities to help develop their early phonics skills. We have focused on Aspects 1–3 of Phase 1, exploring environmental sounds, instrumental sounds, and body percussion. The children have been tuning into the sounds around them, listening carefully to what they can hear indoors and outdoors, and exploring how different instruments and objects can make a variety of noises. These experiences are helping the children to develop their listening and attention skills, laying strong foundations for later sound discrimination and early reading development.

#### **Mathematics**

This term, the children have explored maths through lots of practical, hands-on play. We've been learning to notice when groups have more, fewer, or the same, and have enjoyed building and exploring shapes using different materials. The children have also had fun spotting and creating repeating patterns and hearing and saying number names through songs, rhymes, and counting games.
